



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

God of all power, Ruler of the Universe, you are worthy of glory and praise. Glory to you for ever and ever.



On the night he was betrayed he took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.
